Title: Aircraft Cub Interest badge

PROPOSAL

Proposed that the "**AIRCRAFT**" interest badge be changed as defined below:

Current requirements:

Do any THREE of the following:

1. Identify FIVE different aircraft in flight or from models or photographs
2. Help make a pilot trainer
3. Make and fly a model aircraft (not necessarily engine driven).
4. Make a sketch of a favourite model aircraft and name the parts of the aircraft.

Proposed requirements:

Do any **FOUR** of the following:

- 1 Identify FIVE different aircraft in flight or from models or photographs
OR Attend an air show and list 5 planes seen at air show
- 2 Make and fly a model aircraft (not necessarily engine driven).
- 3 Make a sketch of a favourite model aircraft and name the parts of the aircraft.
- 4 **List the basic emergency procedures of an aircraft. (This is the information that passengers on any flight are required to read at commencement of their flight.)**

- 5 **List six items that are not allowed to be taken on board an aircraft.**
- 6 **Explain the location and use of the following places at an airfield**
 - **Hanger**
 - **Apron**
 - **Tower**
 - **Main Airports building**
 - **Windsock**

MOTIVATION

Most of the Pack Scouters in my district have no idea what a pilot trainer is. There is also only in very old copies of the cub trail a photo of what a pilot trainer is. I only know it as I stumbled by chance onto this picture many years ago. To make this pilot trainer requires a knowledgeable person in the craft of woodwork.
