Title: Scout Flags

PROPOSAL

Rule 919.2 change as follows:

919.2 Flags of an oblong shape of a purple colour and bearing the "SCOUTS South Africa" logo and rope design with "be prepared" with an additional colour as ~~a badge or emblem~~, specified in Rules 919.2.1, ~~and~~ 919.2.2 and 919.2.3, if desired, the title of the Group:

919.2.1 Yellow for Cub Packs ~~with a wolf's head in green~~;

919.2.2 Green for Scout Troops;
Navy-blue for Sea Scout Troops;
Pale-blue for Air Scout Troops;

919.2.3 Red for Rover Crews. ~~These flags shall bear the badge of the Association (Rule 212.2).~~

Rule 919.7 change as follows:

919.7 The Scout flag of the national headquarters of the Association ~~will be the same as the World Scout flag, a fleur-de-lis Gules, each of the outer petals pierced with a mullet, and the centre petal charged with a springbok head caboshed or, on a field Vert within a circlet or intertwined.~~ Occasions for flying are the same as for the World Scout flag.

The following diagram sets out the example designs for the flags:





Motivation

At the last National Scout Council in 2009, the CEO was asked to bring possible designs to Council for Scout groups that are in line with the new branding. Furthermore the cost of the flags should be affordable.

It is important from a marketing perspective that the brand of the Association is promoted. Flags are an important aspect to assist with the marketing.

In this format the flags for the Cubs and Scouts will be selling for R250 each. This is made possible as SAHQ will be able to make a number of flags at one time. The Rover, Air Scout and Sea Scout flags will be more expensive as a much smaller number of flags will be produced.
